A LIFELONG LOVE AFFAIR WITH IMAGERY

"I HAVE NEVER CONSIDERED MYSELF A PHOTOGRAPHER PER SE, BUT MORE A DODDLER, A DREAMER AN ARTIST"

MY INITIAL PHOTOGRAPHIC EXPERIENCE WAS LIMITED TO WEDDINGS AND OCCASIONAL PORTRAITS IN THOSE STRESSFUL DAYS OF FILM CAPTURE. I PUT ALL MY CAMERA GEAR AWAY IN 1977 AND WITH THE EXCEPTION OF FAMILY, DID NOT TAKE ANY PHOTOGRAPHS UNTIL MY FIRST TRIP TO ITALY IN 2006. THIS ITALIAN ADVENTURE, AND WITH ENCOURAGEMENT FROM PEERS, IN PARTICULAR ROBERT PICCOLI, "FRESCO IMAGES" WAS FOUNDED AND NOW "DOUG PORTER IMAGERY".

MELBOURNE BORN AND BRED, MY BACKGROUND IS ART COLLEGE (PAINTING, ILLUSTRATION AND PRINTMAKING) FOLLOWED BY EXTENSIVE TIME WORKING IN THE PROFESSIONAL PHOTOGRAPHIC INDUSTRY. MY PASSION FOR ART NEVER CEASED AND WITH THE ADVENT OF THE DIGITAL AGE I FOUND A NEW LOVE IN DIGITAL EDITING AND PHOTO COMPOSITION.

WHEREAS MANY PHOTOGRAPHERS SEEM TO RESTRICT THEMSELVES TO ONE "GENRE", I PREFER TO ATTEMPT AND EXPLORE ALL THE DIFFERENT AND VARIED FIELDS OF THIS ARTFORM.

MY PHOTOGRAPHS ARE THE "DITCHES" ON WHICH I BUILD THE VISION I HAVE, NOT ALWAYS A LITERAL RECORDING OF MY SUBJECT BUT AN ATTEMPT TO BRING TO THE ARTWORK A PIECE OF MYSELF.

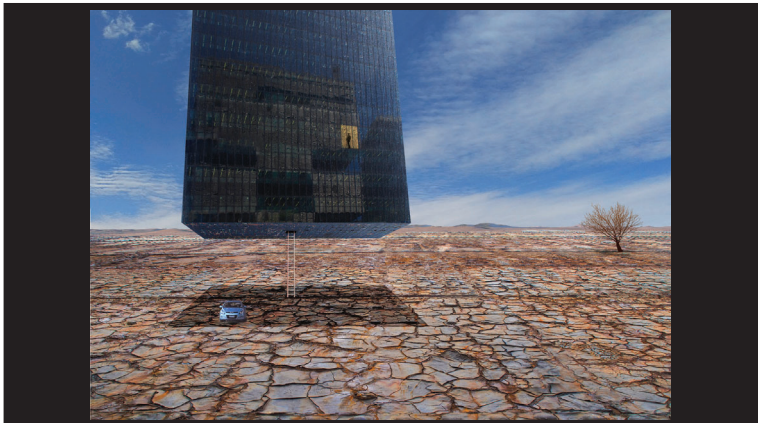

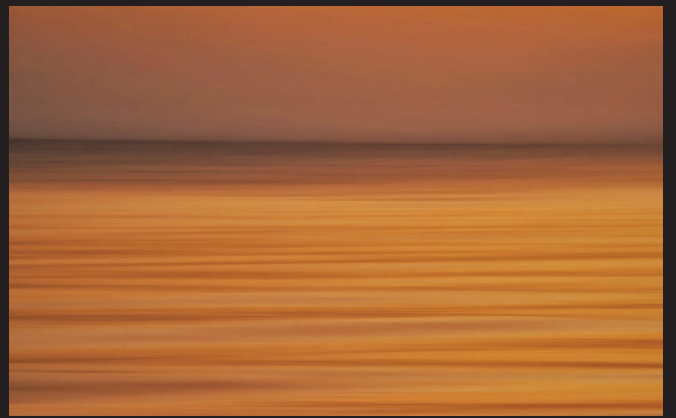

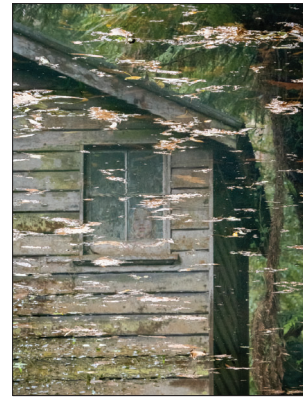

AI and Photography

Boris Eldagsen was [awarded the top gong](#) in the Sony World Photography Awards for a haunting black and white image entitled The Electrician, part of his Pseudomnesia series.

But the image was generated using an AI program. Handing back the prize at the London award ceremony in April, he said: "Thank you for selecting my image and making this a historic moment, as it is the first AI-generated image to win in a prestigious international photography competition."

"It was a test to see if photo competitions are prepared for [AI] ... They are not."

He maintains he hadn't intended to deceive the judges. Instead, he wanted to start a conversation about where AI art fits in the photography world.

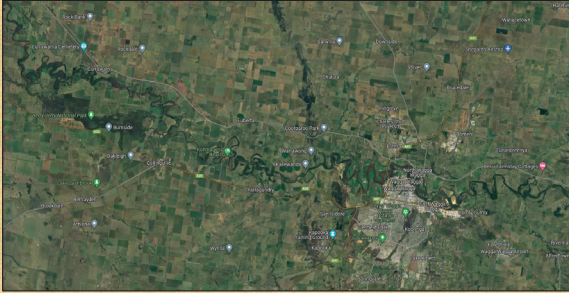


"How-to" or "How was it made"

Birds at sunset
Section Winner, April



I took these photos while camping by
the Murrumbidgee River near Wagga

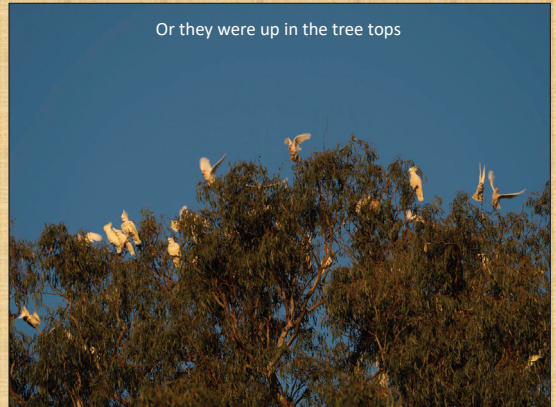


Sometimes the birds were on the river banks feeding

(here sulphur crested cockatoos and corellas)



Or they were up in the tree tops



There were plenty of birds (this is a tree full of Sulphur crested cockatoos)

Or they were flying, circulating around



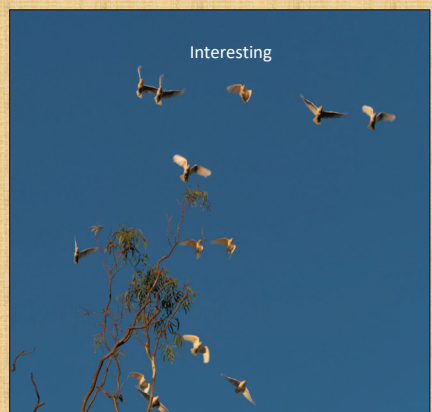
Depending on the light they looked either very ordinary

Interesting



Or very interesting,
but by then it was getting so dark that focusing was hard



As I was shooting handheld it soon got too dark even to keep trees in focus.



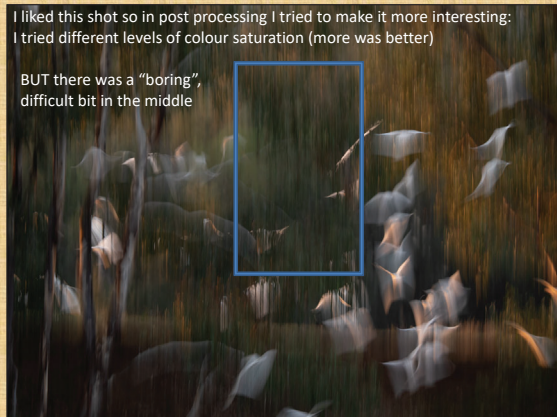
SO, I took a shot using intentional camera movement (up/ down)
(to make the blurryness of the birds & trees less obvious).

Shot 1



I liked this shot so in post processing I tried to make it more interesting:
I tried different levels of colour saturation (more was better)

BUT there was a "boring",
difficult bit in the middle



But in the end I decided to "hide" the gap
by adding extra birds from another shot.



I also further brightened the highlights and
increased the saturation/ vibrance

I tried various crops to try to make it "better"



The shot from which I stole the extra birds



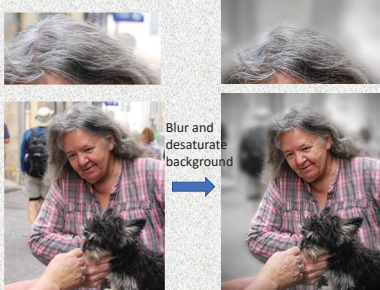

Selections etc.

Ross Eddington has asked for more coverage of selections etc.

His image below as a working example



Switch to Photoshop

- Photoshop's new AI powered selection tools – select subject etc. can work well, but have limitations
- Refine by adding or subtracting as needed
- Select and Mask to refine selection
- Invert selection if needed
- With complex selections it is a good idea to save the selection to a channel as you go along
- “flyaway” hair can be problematic, especially against a complex background
 - use plain backgrounds/greenscreens where possible to achieve contrast between hair and non-hair
 - Try different colour channels to see if you get better contrast
 - Try sharpening before selection
 - If it is really important, zoom in to pixel level editing (eg 600%) and paint the hairs onto the mask.
- Think about scaling. If you have, say, an 8200 x 5500 px image and are aiming at reducing it to a final image that will be, say 1920x1080 px then don't worry about features that are 1 pixel wide on the original. They won't be visible in the final.
- Consider using *Lens Blur* rather than *Gaussian Blur* to blur backgrounds

- Making shadows

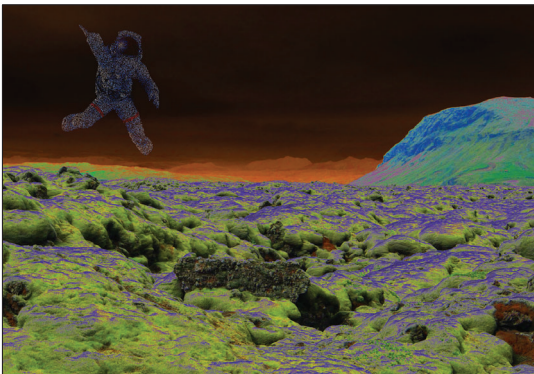

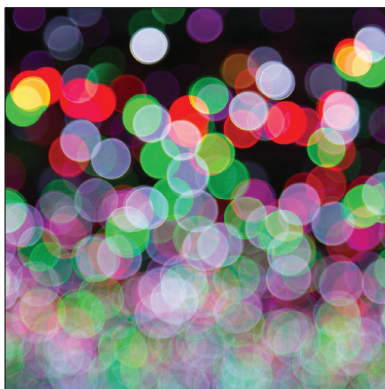
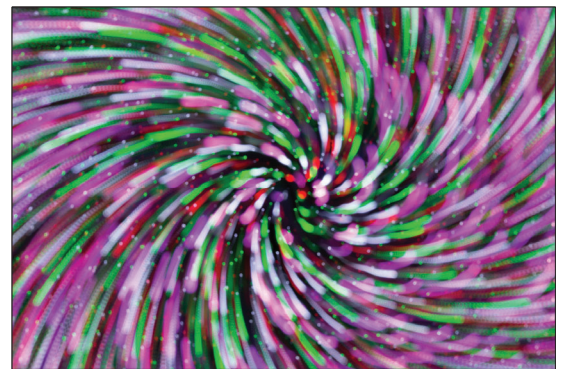
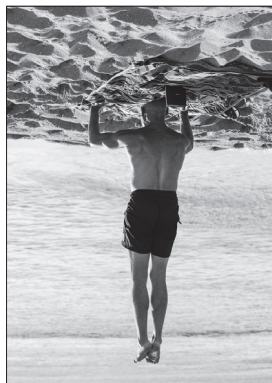
Creative Images

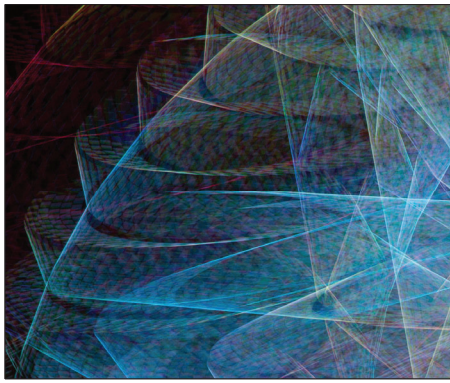
"straight from camera"

with minimal post-processing


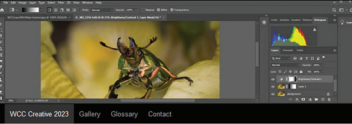
No need to be a photoshop whiz, you can get creative images straight from camera

- Unusual objects
- Usual objects, unusual perspective; abstraction
- Creative motion blur (slow exposure: moving object; camera movement; zooming)
- Creative focus blur
- Etc....
